CHRIS CARR has been in Radio for 22 years. The last 12 of those years were spent at K102 in Minneapolis, where he enjoyed great ratings and an incredible romance with his audience. His show has been number one for 5 years straight in all key demographics from 18-34 to 25-54. Chris commanded the largest share of any afternoon show in the United States.

In 2007, Chris brought home the Country Music Association Award for Major Market Personality. He also won the Twin Cities Best Radio Personality Award, presented by the Twin Cities Media Network for community service and strong ratings performance. Chris proposed to his wife, Stephanie, at the Minnesota Renaissance Festival. He rode up on a white horse, jumped off, and got down on one knee. They have been married for 6 years and have two boys, Jameson, 3 and Landon, 2.

Chris is from Madison, WI. Yes, he's a die-hard Packers fan, but when he was a kid and the Packers were terrible, ironically, the Bengals became his AFC team when they changed their uniforms. He'll never forget the depression after they lost that first Super Bowl to the 49ers in 1981.

Chris makes people laugh. His dead-on sense of comedic timing is phenomenal. On the flip-side, when it comes to community, charity or other serious events, Chris motivates listeners to take action. His passion and compassion for the situation and the lives of the people affected is genuine and honest..
